On World Biodiversity Day, Rodney College Environment Group members headed to Atiu Creek Regional Park to help make our part of the world a little bit greener.

We were working with Conservation Volunteers NZ personnel Clair and Ursula and our event was part of the Matariki Tu Rākau programme. As part



of the larger One Billion Trees programme Matariki Tu Rākau is an opportunity for communities to plant trees to recognise both past and present contributions made by the New Zealand Defence Forces. Funded by the Ministry for Primary Industries, the programme began last year to commemorate the 100-year anniversary of the end of the First World War and the goal is to plant 350,000 trees by the end of 2020.

If our sore muscles at the end of the day are anything to go by, we reckon we made a valuable contribution to the programme and probably planted around 500 plants, including a number of future forest giants - kahikatea. There was far more to getting the trees planted than just digging the holes as the site was very steep and quite a lot of the time was spent ferrying the plants down to the site. That said, the weather improved and we had lots of laughs and even got to lay out a lot of plants ready for more volunteers arriving in a few days time. We had a really rewarding day out in a beautiful local park, and our thanks goes to Mrs Callachan who organised our participation, Mrs Yorke and everyone else who took part. 
